12 March 2024	19h00 – 20h00	Towards sustainable food systems – understanding the nutrient contribution of dairy Andrew Fletcher, Fonterra & Riddett Institute	Food systems exist to provide nutrition, and one which fails to provide sufficient nutrition can never be sustainable. Before we begin talking about making radical changes to food systems or diets, it is important we understand the nutrient contribution of different elements of the system. This talk will highlight work from the Sustainable Nutrition Initiative with a particular focus on the contribution of milk and dairy to global nutrition.

In this webinar, Dr Mitch Kanter, will give an overview of the project, the implications of the data on assessing protein quality of foods and the potential next steps.

14 November 2024	19h00 – 20h00	Exploring the research component of Pathways to Dairy Net Zero Professor Richard Dewhurst, Global Research Alliance on Agricultural Greenhouse Gases (GRA) and Head of SRUC's Dairy Research Centre	This webinar will explore the research component of P2DNZ, which is working to identify practical pathways for dairy systems worldwide. Professor Richard Dewhurst will explain the science that quantifies GHG Emissions from global dairy. His talk will discuss the emissions profiles for the different dairy production systems, the mitigation opportunities and critically the impact the cumulative emissions for the different GHG gases have on global warming.



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
